Worked in the office this mornig, did not get to school till after it was taken up. Mr. North, the Bloomington teacher, & a lady were there till recess. He seemed to be well pleased with the school, & made a speech of encouragement to the scholars. We played ball some. Marched awhile after noon. It rained about all after noon. Bro. Daugherty came from the log house this evening. He is going to work here a while. Got Got the "Gospel Sword" this evening. J. P. Haver is helping Fisher publish it.

Tuesday, Mar. 31. - 1897.

I worked on the correspondence till school time. Bro. Daugherty & Sid sawed wood today. We played ball some at school. They have writtten for the Dakota ball club to come down & play with us this week. Do not know yet whether they will come or not. John & I popped some corn this evening & after we got through with that I went up to my room & studied till bed time.
